Benjamin Franklin House is organising a celebration for His Majesty's Coronation. We will be hosting special tours and live streaming the events of the day!

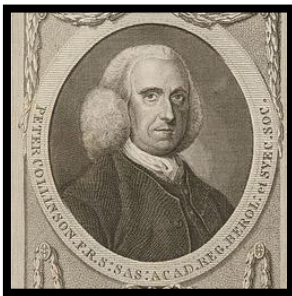
